The Lord God Is with You and Reveals Himself to You by the Preaching of His Word

READINGS

1 Samuel 3:1-10 (11-20) Psalm 139:1-10 (antiphon: v. 14) 1 Corinthians 6:12-20 John 1:43-51

SUMMARY OF TODAY'S READINGS

The Lord God Is with You and Reveals Himself to You by the Preaching of His Word
The Lord Jesus calls Philip and Nathanael to "come and see" that He is "the Son of God" and
"the King of Israel" (John 1:43–49). And they shall see even "greater things than these" (John
1:50). For His body is the temple of God on earth, and by His priestly sacrifice the heavens will
be opened to all who believe and are baptized into Him. Therefore, He calls Philip and
Nathanael, first to hear His Word and then to speak as apostles, even as He once called Samuel
and established him "as a prophet of the LORD" (1 Sam. 3:20). As the Lord was with Samuel
"and let none of his words fall to the ground" (1 Sam. 3:19), He also accompanies and upholds
the preachers of His Word in our day. Thus, by the Gospel that is preached to you, "your body is
a temple of the Holy Spirit within you" (1 Cor. 6:19). Since your body thus belongs to the Body
of Christ, is meant "for the Lord" and shall be raised up like Him, now "glorify God in your
body" (1 Cor. 6:13–20).

CELEBRATING THE SEASON OF EPIPHANY THE TIME OF EPIPHANY

Begins with evening prayer on January 5 and ends the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday. Epiphany is one of the oldest seasons in the Christian Church Year, second only to the Easter Season. This season of lights emphasizes Jesus' manifestation (or epiphany, from the Greek word epiphaneia) as God and man. The earliest Christians called the Feast of the Epiphany the Theophany ("revelation of God"). When the Gentile Magi came to worship Jesus, they show that everyone now has access to God. Now all people, Jew, and Gentile, can come to God's temple to worship, because Jesus is the new temple: God in the flesh. The Epiphany of Our Lord (January 6) marks the celebration of the visit of the Magi.

Epiphany may include as many as nine Sundays, depending on he date of Easter. This season is marked at its beginning and at its end by two important feasts of Christ.

During Epiphany, we worship Jesus, who has given all mankind access to God through Himself.

Matthew 2:1-12 Matthew 3:13-17 John 2:1-11 EPIPHANY PRACTICES AND TRADITIONS

- Like Christmas, the Epiphany of Our Lord, the Baptism of Our Lord, and the Transfiguration of Our Lord are feast days of Jesus. The colour for feast days is white, the colour of divinity, purity, and joy. The Sundays after the Epiphany focus on the growth of Jesus' ministry, and the colour green is used to symbolize that growth.
- On the first Sunday after the Epiphany, the Church celebrates the Baptism of Our Lord. The Father sent Jesus to bear the sins of the World. So Jesus steps down into baptismal waters so that He can soak up the sins of the World. He is baptized into our sins so that Baptism might be into His death and resurrection for the forgiveness of sins..
- The Feast of the Transfiguration, celebrated on the last Sunday in the Epiphany season, is a significant and uniquely Lutheran contribution to the Christian Church Calendar. This festival commemorates the moment on the Mount of Transfiguration when three of Jesus' disciples glimpse their Lord in divine splendor, seeing Him as the centre of the Law (Moses) and the Prophets (Elijah). Jesus proclaims to His disciples, then and now, that He is the long-awaited one who has come to die for the sins of the world and be raised again in glory.
- The Transfiguration of Our Lord is the last Sunday before the Lent. Because we give up singing *Alleluia* during Lent, at the close of the service on Transfiguration we say farewell to *Alleluia* with the hymn "Alleluia, Song of Gladness" (LSB 417).
